CALL TO ORDER

Chair J.R. Gaylor called the meeting to order at 2:45 p.m. (EST) in the Gates Room of the Omni Severin Hotel, 40 West Jackson Place, Indianapolis, Indiana.

ROLL CALL/ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA

Pat Konkle called the roll. A quorum was declared with 11 Trustees present. The agenda was approved by consensus of the Board.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes of the December 4, 2013 and December 19, 2013, meetings had been distributed. Trustee John Stachura made a motion to accept the minutes as distributed. Trustee Anne Emison Wishard seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously.

CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS

Board Chair J.R. Gaylor thanked all of the Trustees for their attendance and engagement at today's Board Retreat. He also stated that he is a member of the Indiana Career Council, and the president is a member of the Community Colleges Best Practices Taskforce, which means that VU is well positioned in the state. President Helton stated that the Taskforce meets about every two weeks, and VU will give a presentation to the Indiana Career Council on March 24.

REPORTS FROM TRUSTEE SUBCOMMITTEES

University Affairs Committee

Curriculum Items

Acting Committee Chair Anne Emison Wishard asked Provost Chuck Johnson to report on the curriculum items. He reported that in order for Vincennes University to meet all of the state's outcomes, guidelines are being proposed for the addition of 2 and 3 credit hour courses to the University's Core Curriculum Items. In addition, two courses, MUSI 219 Introduction to World Music and SOCL 141 Foundations of Social Life, have been added to the

University Core Curriculum. All of these have been approved by the Curriculum and Academic Affairs Committee, the Faculty Senate, Provost Johnson, President Helton, and the Trustees' University Affairs Committee.

MOTION #14-03

Trustee Anne Emison Wishard made a motion to approve the attached curriculum items. Trustee George Ridgway seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously.

Retention Update

Acting Chair Wishard asked Provost Johnson to give a report on student retention. He reported that the focus is on four main areas – curriculum; policies and structures; faculty and staff, and students. Various efforts are being incorporated to improve student retention, and those activities were discussed.

Tobacco Policy Update

Acting Chair Wishard asked Provost Johnson to give a report on the Tobacco Policy. He stated that potential modifications to VU's Tobacco Policy and a communications plan are being reviewed. The smart phone app regarding the designated smoking zones is being refined and should be available for use in the Spring 2014 Start VU program. In addition, students will be asked to respond to a survey regarding tobacco use on VU's campuses.

Acting Chair Emison asked President Helton to give a report on the alcohol requests received in his office. President Helton stated that five alcohol requests have been received, as listed below:

Trustee Anne Emison Wishard made a motion to approve the alcohol requests listed above. Trustee John Stachura seconded the motion, and the motion carried with nine yeas and two nays from Trustees Darrel Bobe and Tim Grove.

REPORTS FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE LEADERSHIP

Marketing/Enrollment Report

Kristi Deetz, Senior Director of External Relations, reviewed first day enrollment figures for the Spring 2014 term and provided snapshot comparisons to demonstrate enrollment changes as the semester progresses. She also explained that March 1 is the spring census date which will present a better comparison to previous enrollments. In Spring 2013, the system-wide headcount was 13,329. Deetz then segued to recruitment for future terms by providing an update on the new partnerships with Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) and 21st Century Scholars. Over 800 student reservations were received for the JAG visitation day. The success of the group visitation program is a strong factor in the increase of applications received for Fall 2014. At the time of the board meeting, application intake for the Vincennes Campus had increased by 7.6 percent when compared to the same date for Fall 2013, and 80.5 percent of the applicants had been accepted. The fall application total for the Aviation Technology Center was up by 11 while the Jasper Campus applications were down by 11.

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

President Helton thanked the Trustees for taking their time to attend the Board Retreat. In addition, he noted his appreciation for Kristi Deetz's efforts in bringing the large JAG student group to campus. He also expressed that he hoped Vice President Phil Rath's meeting with coal mining officials and legislators would be a success.

Board Chair Gaylor stated that he would like to be kept informed regarding the health care cost containment issue, and President Helton responded that he will keep the Trustees informed. In addition, Trustee John Stachura asked about the Funeral Service Education Program's results. Provost Johnson reported that the Funeral Service Education accreditation team was on campus a few weeks ago, and he will keep the Trustees informed about the team's report.
