AMENDED ITEM TO AGENDA:

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Vincennes University and Vincennes University Foundation

President Johnson reported that the VU/VU Foundation Relations Committee met in March to review the MOU between VU and the VU Foundation. The Foundation's Executive Director also serves as the Senior Director of Institutional Advancement for the University, which reports to the President. As a result, the University President has authority to take temporary measures if there is ever an issue with the performance related to the Foundation Executive Director. The President also makes recommendations to the Foundation Board, with respect to the employment status or hiring of an Executive Director. This process creates a more direct line of communication and accountability between the University and the Foundation. Now that there are individuals in key roles with the Foundation, it is helping the process to move forward of focusing on fundraising and alumni relationships. President Johnson recommended that the Board approve the MOU, and after approval, it will then go to the VU Foundation Board for final approval at their May meeting. President Johnson clarified that a suggested wording change be made on page 13 of the MOU to the following:

Should either party choose to terminate this agreement: All debts owed by one party to the other will be paid within 180 days of termination of this agreement.

<u>MOTION # 21-09</u>

With no questions from the Board, Chair Stachura asked for a motion to approve the MOU. Trustee Mike Sievers made a motion to approve, and Trustee Scott Brand seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with 14 yeas and 0 nays, with the motion passing unanimously.

REPORTS FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE LEADERSHIP

Recruitment/Enrollment Report

Sarah Fortune, Senior Director of External Relations, shared a report highlighting spring enrollment comparisons in various categories, which were system-wide, race and ethnicity, campus housing, commuter, and student type. Ms. Fortune also reported on greater efforts being made on virtual recruitment. She also shared with the Board the recent addition of Interim Admissions Director, Brenda Knebel, whose focus will be to help lead the Admissions team's efforts to recruit the fall 2021-22 class, finish the implementation of the new Slate customer relationship management system, and begin planning for the 2022-23 recruiting season.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRACK & FIELD COACHES AND STUDENT-ATHLETES

President Johnson introduced Head Track and Field Coach, Chris Gafner, and asked him to introduce student-athletes Matteo Capello and Makinzi Meurer for their recent Indoor Track and Field National Championships. Coach Gafner praised the work ethic and accomplishments of each of the student-athletes. He also expressed appreciated to his Assistant Track and Field Coach, Tim Marsee for his outstanding career. The President expressed appreciation to both coaches and student-athletes for all their hard work and great accomplishments. Board Chair Stachura also expressed congratulations and appreciation to the coaches and student-athletes for all their accomplishments.

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

- The President congratulated all the faculty and staff that had been approved for promotion and tenure.
- The President expressed gratitude to the Lilly Endowment. In addition to the \$2.5 million grant awarded to VU last fall, the institution will soon be receiving an \$8 million grant from the Endowment. This grant will focus on three areas:
 - Development of Collaborative Robots (Cobots) and establishment of the Center for Applied Robotics and Automation, which will be housed on the Vincennes campus.
 - Focus on a K-8 program and partnership with Purdue's IN-MaC (Indiana Manufacturing Competitiveness Center), which will feed into our CTE Early College programs to attract students.
 - Business & Industry component; VU is working in concert with the Telamon Corporation and Techmon Robot Corporation to develop industry standard applications and training to proliferate the use of Cobots in key industry sectors. Cummins and Toyota are both investing in Cobots.
- The President acknowledged and thanked Stephanie Stemle and VP Tony Hahn for all their hard work on obtaining all the Lilly grants.
- VP Tony Hahn presented information regarding the 2021 Legislative session, including information on the biennium budget, various bills passed, and other legislative items.
- President Johnson acknowledged Head Women's Basketball Coach and VU Athletic Director Harry Meeks for his 700th win in March and his induction in the NJCAA Women's Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
- StartVU programs have started up again.
- The non-resident scholarship is now being extended to students from Kentucky, Ohio, and Michigan, joining Illinois residents in qualifying for in-state tuition.

- A \$10,000 Residential Opportunity Scholarship is being offered for all new students and eligible returning students on the Vincennes campus. VU will allocate additional funds for scholarships offered to students at all VU sites and locations.
- May 15th will be the virtual commencement program.
- Plans continue to develop regarding in-person learning and in-person activities for the launch of the Fall, 2021 semester.
- President Johnson introduced Brenda Knebel, who will serve as the Interim Admissions Director. The search continues for a full-time, permanent Admissions Director.
- The President acknowledged the hard work Sarah Fortune has done for Admissions and the External Relations department.
- Today is Denim Day, which is a day of recognition in support of victims of sexual violence.

Chair Stachura acknowledged and welcomed Ms. Knebel to VU.
