Biographical or Historical Sketch: Prominent Vincennes merchant and public official. Ewing served in the U.S. House of Representatives as a Whig (1833-1839) and both the House and Senate in Indiana.

John Ewing introduced the *WABASH TELEGRAPH* on 25 May 1827. It supported the politics of Henry Clay and the Whig Party and stopped publishing on 21 November 1828, when Ewing was elected to the legislature.

John Ewing was a bachelor with no Vincennes relations.
